#### Advent and the Jesse Tree

The season of Advent is a season of penance and prayer in preparation for Christmas. John the Baptist is telling us to take life seriously. Life is short. It could end any time. Each moment should not be wasted, but must be spent in honest preparation for the coming of the Lord. Eternal life awaits those who are prepared to receive the Lord. Life must be taken seriously in view of eternity. Each week a picture or symbol will be added to our Jesse Tree. We add Isaiah (a scroll), Jesse (a house), David (a harp) and Solomon (a crown). The third of our Advent candles - the Candle of Joy - will be lit to remind us that Jesus was born to save us. This third Advent Sunday is also known as Gaudete Sunday, Latin for 'rejoice.'
